1 2019 Le Volte dell'Ornellaia

This Italian red is complex and fruity, with delicate floral and spicy notes. The tannic and smooth texture is striking on the palate, ending in a crisp and lively finish.

2 2018 Pierre Ponnelle Savigny-Lès-Beaune

Pierre Ponnelle was one of the great figures of 19th century Burgundy. His keen interest in the sciences led to him being credited with the development of most modern-day oenological techniques. 150 years later, his wines still reflect the purest Burgundy tradition.

12 Ronan by Clinet White Bordeaux

This white wine is made by the famous Château Clinet, and it's a delicious reflection of the style and savoir-faire of the famous Pomerol winery. It's fresh, fruit-forward, and delicately spiced, making it the perfect choice for a dinner party.

Introduce yourself to Oregon's signature grape varietal with this exquisite Pinot Noir. A beautiful, complex range of aromas featuring black cherry, peppercorn, and hints of persimmon lead to a rich and generous mouthfeel with flavors of plum and spices.

14 Eve's Drop Chenin Blanc Viognier

Viognier is a white varietal from southern France, but more and more California wineries are producing examples of this versatile, food-friendly grape. Blended with Chenin Blanc here, it offers enticing notes of honey and stone fruit and a clean, crisp finish.

15 Country Ridge Cellars Napa Valley Chardonnay

You'll love the honeycrisp apples, lemon curd, and key lime notes on the nose which are set in a framework of toast, caramel, and vanilla. This medium-bodied wine has a crisp, juicy citrus finish that pairs nicely with the flavors of fall.

16 2019 Château Fontaubert

This red blend is a superb value at its price, from a property that's been family-owned for generations. Made primarily from Merlot, it's rich, complex, and balanced—a perfect pairing for pasta, pizza, and roasts.

This is a well-balanced Cabernet Sauvignon with dark fruit notes of blackberry and cherry, complemented by notes of cedar and a long, lingering finish. Enjoy it with grilled beef or pork on cool autumn nights.

18 Torraio Super Toscana

A delicious introduction to the Super Tuscan winemaking style, the Torraio has aromas of crushed berries, cherries, and oak on the nose. The palate is lush and full-bodied, and it finishes with round tannins and a long finish.
